Finding the Lowest Common Multiple (LCM) of 4 and 6

Step 1: List the Multiples of Each Number

- Multiples of 4: 4, 8, 12, 16, 20, 24, 28, ...
- Multiples of 6: $6, 12, 18, 24, 30, 36, \dots$

Step 2: Identify the Common Multiples

• Common multiples of 4 and 6: $12, 24, 36, \dots$

Step 3: Choose the Smallest Common Multiple

• The smallest common multiple of 4 and 6 is 12.

Finding the Highest Common Factor (HCF) of 24 and 36

Step 1: Find the Factors of Each Number

- Factors of 24: 1, 2, 3, 4, 6, 8, 12, 24
- Factors of 36: 1, 2, 3, 4, 6, 9, 12, 18, 36

Step 2: Identify the Common Factors

• Common factors of 24 and 36: 1, 2, 3, 4, 6, 12

Step 3: Choose the Greatest Common Factor

• The largest common factor is 12.

HCF(24, 36) = 12
